Mini-workshops

Publicity Committee Representative Ellen Zimet reported that the mini-workshops are going very well. For September and October workshops under the auspices of guest teachers will be offered on Wednesday afternoons and some weekends. The cost for a month of Wednesday workshops for members will be \$40.00 and for non-members, \$60.00. If you prefer a daily

charge, the cost for members will be \$10.00 and for nonmembers, \$15.00. Weekend workshop prices will vary.

Assistance League Project

The Assistance League project asks for artists to prepare ink line drawings with watercolor washes by August 29th of specified houses in Astoria. All works of the house will be displayed at the specific house and the sales proceeds will go to the artist. The League will choose one work from each house to photograph and use for a card. The sales proceed from the cards will go to the League. Work must be matted and shrink-wrapped. Further information is available at Trail's End.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Beverly Peck stated that Our Astoria Bank balance on July 1, 2008, was \$613.33. Our July income was \$291.15 and our expenses were \$998.77. Beverly moved \$600.00 from our Capital One Money market account to our Bank of Astoria account leaving us with a balance of \$505.71 as of August 1, 2008. Our Capital One Money Market account is now \$6,699.33. Our membership currently stands at 137 members. Beverly has created a clearing account. If a customer writes a check to TEAA rather than the artist, Beverly will cash it, write a check to the artist for the amount, and keep the clearing account at zero balance. She has posted her directions for filling out different types of receipts at the desk. Remember, the customer is the buyer and the artist is the seller.

Electrical Inspection

President Jo announced we are now up to code and have passed inspection.

Exhibit Manager's Report

Exhibit Manager Albert Wood reported that in July we sold eight pieces of jewelry for \$213, twenty cards for \$179, two pieces of fused glass for \$65, one piece of fiber art for \$82.50, six pieces of shrink-wrapped art for \$236, one photograph for \$15, five framed pieces for \$490, and one sculpture for \$50. Total sales amounted to \$1,315.50. For our August show sixty-seven artists put in one

hundred thirteen pieces of art. One hundred fifty guests visited our show. Our hanging committee did a great job. After Jo Pomeroy-Crockett and Judy Fredrikson planned the layout, Show Hanging Manager Jane Means, Tom Means, Albert Wood, Susan Bish, Jo Pomeroy-Crockett and Lou Kister hung the show. We have sold several pieces.

Office Manager

The role of the office manager consists of filing materials and responding to phone messages. Shirley Veit has been organizing and categorizing our files. She will give an overview of an office manager's responsibilities at our September potluck meeting. Shirley will be moving to Arizona in the near future. Thank you, Shirley, for all your help.

Other

*President Jo shared information about an exciting new product which will soon be available at Dots' N Doodles. Golden is putting out Open Acrylic which stays moist for a longer time and can be used with regular acrylics.

*The Six-by-Six show opens Saturday night, August 9th, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. as part of the Astoria Art Walk.

*Patty Davis showed some of the artwork from the Transition Center which TEAA cosponsors.

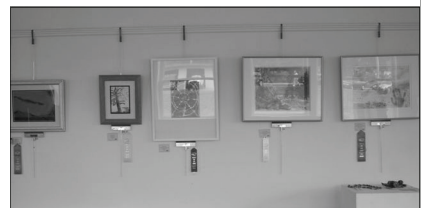
