Featured Artist

Lynda Campbell is July's Featured Artist. Lynda shared highlights from her family life, career, and art.

Lynda has been married for 45 years to a supportive husband. They have two daughters. She is a proud alumni of the U of O where she graduated with a BA in Art/Art Education. Her first job was designing and teaching in a brand new art room in Springfield, Oregon. She and her husband moved to Seaside in 1967 where she took a job teaching art at Seaside High School. After taking time off to have her children, she returned to teaching in 1979 at Broadway Middle School in Seaside.



Lynda had her own radio show on KSWB for several years called Lynda's Beachbag where she talked about any and all subjects with varied guests. She also volunteered for the Miss Oregon Pageant, Beachcomber's Festival and other activities.

She and her husband travel and her most special art experience was sitting where Van Gogh sat when he painted the cathedral in Auver.

She didn't have time for doing art until this stage in her life. Kathy Moberg kept at her until she started working with pastels and joined TEAA.

Lynda expressed her appreciation for



the award. and told members that she feels her favorite quote below embodies her good experience with TEAA, "Everything we bring to the table enriches us all."

Judged Art Show

Gheri Fouts, this year's Judged Art Show coordinator, told the members at the July General meeting that there are 13 categories of art this year, two of them for children. The work will be judged slightly differently this year.

Instead of only three places per medium, each art piece will be placed according to the criteria rather than just ranked within a single category. For example, there could be five first place winners in oils, and no first place winner in other categories.

There will still be one 'Best of Show'. The judges will be using three major criteria for judging. Each piece will be critiqued according to:

Who's Looking at Us?

In the last 6 months, the TEAA website had 1,512 unique visitors viewing the site. Those visitors went to the site's pages 41,514 times (hits). This is four times as many hits as last year at the same time.

The most viewed pages in order of viewing were the Gallery Slide Show, Artists' pages (which leads to your individual artist web pages), and the Calendar.

Around 78% of our visitors either directly have the site address or are accessing from an email link.

About 13% use a search engine – like Google - to check out TEAA. The rest are referred from other sites, the top being the Oregon Coast Arts Commission (our classes are advertised there).

Those of you that have contacted Kitty and have had her photograph some of your art work know that our web site is proving to be excellent exposure for individual artists and it is also a great way to show your work to friends and family who live outside of our area.

If you haven't put together a presentation yet, Kitty will walk you through one on August 14 from 1-4 pm. For \$25 you will end up with your own web page, slide show of your art materials (with music) and a personal bio. Call her at 503-325-0342 to reserve a spot and learn what to bring. Our Bank of Astoria balance as of June 1, 2009 was \$1,739.32. Our income in June was \$3,905.75 and our expenses were \$1,289.25 leaving a balance of \$4,355.82. Our Capitol One Money Market account plus our three special funds is now worth \$4,810.96. Our non cash donations for June included our Highway 101 signs and our Pacific Way sign provided by Albert Wood, Susan Bish and Lou Kister and our Kiwanis Tournament provided by Beverly Peck.
