

Mary Nolen has been an outdoor photographer for most of her adult life. After retiring she discovered "Scanography" while taking a class at the Oregon Art and Craft School in Portland. Using an Epson flat bed, high resolution scanner she places found objects upside down on the scanner and create stunningly detailed images. The scanner gives her the depth of field that is different than just taking a still life photograph. Her black backgrounds are achieved by creating a black box to cover her images while scanning.

After transferring images to her computer, she uses Photoshop primarily to erase the dust, sand, and dirt that land on her scanner while arranging her pieces. Sometimes she creates a psychedelic look by manipulating her objects while the scanner is moving. She loves being able to create visionally appealing images and designs from natural objects found on her walks. She draws on the inspiration of Old World Still Life painters, which she studied in school and while travelling in Europe.

Mary was born and raised in Michigan. The Petoskey Stone is Michigan's state stone and can sometimes be found in her work. She attended Michigan State University and



Welcome Springtime! I love this season and the urge that often comes with it to renew and refresh our environs inside and out.



Board Reports

Treasurer's Report - Dan Gerth

Dan sent the Balance Sheet, activities, and Directed Funds documents for the month of February via email. The report shows a surplus for the year as of the end of February. Kitty Paino moved to approve the Treasurer's report; Tj Lev seconded. Motion approved.

VP Communication – TJ Lev

Tj reported that she is adding online event calendars for TEAA activities. She also found another contact in Seaside for sending out monthly press releases.
